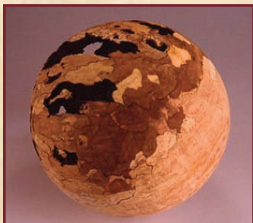

MARCH PROGRAM DAVID ELLSWORTH

An icon of the woodturning community over the past thirty years, David will demonstrate his techniques for small hole shoulder hollowing and turn two natural-topped bowls – the second bowl will be turned at David's *production speed*. He will also critique our *Show & Tell* items.

He will demonstrate the techniques he invented for blind hollowing thin-walled vessels through a small hole with bent tools. His first article, *Hollow Turning*, appeared in the May/June 1979 issue of *Fine Woodworking*. His signature gouge grind is one of the current standards. He is a founder of the American Association of Woodturners (AAW). He was AAW's first President from 1986-1991 and its first Honorary Lifetime Member.



He has written over 50 articles on woodturning and operates the Ellsworth School of Woodturning at his studio in Bucks County, Pennsylvania. His works are included in the permanent collections of 35 museums, including the Smithsonian American Art Museum, the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the Victoria & Albert Museum in London, and the Mint Museum of Craft + Design in Charlotte, North Carolina, as well as countless national and international private collections, including the White House. He was recently honored in as a *Fellow* of the American Craft Council.

PRESIDENT'S PERSPECTIVE

HOPE everyone put their “free time” provided by all the winter weather to good use by turning something new or tinkering in your shop. I’ve been able to get my new shop and turning area into good working order and ready for some serious activity as we hopefully head into warmer weather.

Since we were not able to meet in February, this is just a reminder to plan to weigh in with your thoughts at our March meeting regarding the support of the Woodworker’s Club with MCW demonstrations and workshops. I had proposed in last month’s newsletter the following ideas and will be interested in your thoughts and willingness to participate:

- [1] Conduct Weekend Turning Demonstrations.
- [2] Co-Sponsor Woodcraft’s *Turn for the Troops* by manning lathes on Memorial Day, Veteran’s Day or another designated day.
- [3] Conduct Skill Enhancement Mini-workshops.

Our Warriors-In-Transition support efforts will be changing this month based on a request from the Walter Reed staff. We will continue to assist with one turning workshop on the first Tuesday of each month at the Craft Shop location and then a second class on the third Tuesday of each month put on by the Arts and Craft staff actually at the Walter Reed Hospital site to better serve the warriors needs.

Details are sketchy as to what will be set up on site at the hospital and what level of involvement we will be asked to provide by Chris Wright from the Arts & Crafts Center. Jeff Bridges from the Chesapeake Woodturners Club continues to volunteer as well.

We are continuing to move forward in enhancing the demonstrations with a video monitoring capability as reported in last month’s newsletter. We have a monitor stand now on site that was purchased by Phil Brown along with a 32" TV donated by Clif Poodry.



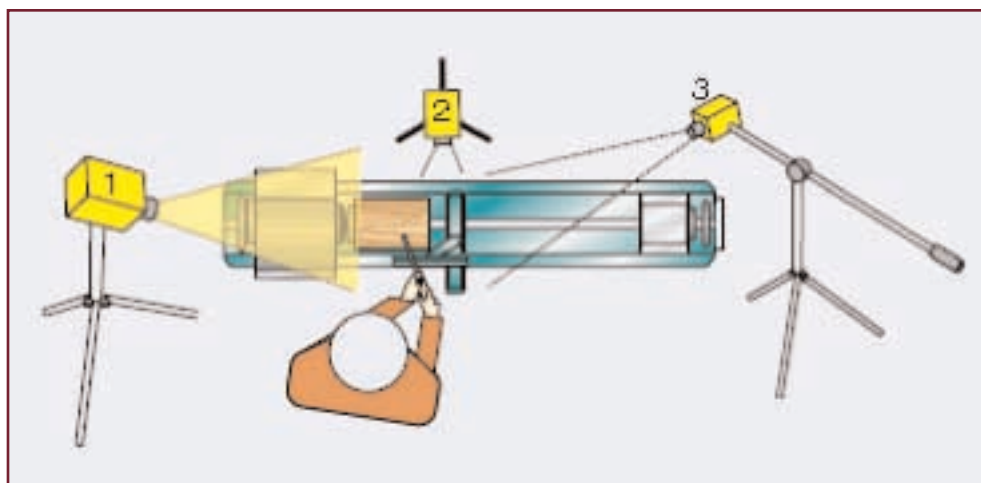
I have ordered 3 mini-cams and a couple of four-channel switching units which will hopefully be here for our March meeting. I’m looking into an inexpensive boom-mount for the tail-stock camera as well that was highlighted in the AAW Journal by Jamie Donaldson.

I am using the AAW *Best Practices Guide for Video Demonstrations* as a framework and hope to implement a three-camera layout as shown below based on Jamie Donaldson’s design for AAW demonstrations, his AAW Best Practices article, and his other published articles.

The challenge is to make the camera positions as unobtrusive as possible while providing easy setup and operation controls for the video operators.

Phil Brown, Bob Browning, and I are starting to work on the requirements for establishing our chapter as a non-profit, tax-exempt organization beginning with developing an operating statement and balance sheet. This is likely a 4-6 month process based on other chapter’s experiences.

➤ **A Lifetime Of Perspective – A Seniors' Art Exhibit at the Jewish Community Center**

One will be selected for you to deliver on Tuesday, April 20th. Space will limit the number of pieces and artists exhibiting. There is no charge to enter and no commission taken on sales. The exhibit is made possible through the generous support of the Deena and Jerome Kaplan Family in memory of Deena's parents. The Jewish Community Center is at 6125 Montrose Road in Rockville.

➤ **Design In Wood Exhibition 2010 – San Diego, California**

Design in Wood is co-sponsored by the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association and the San Diego County Fair. It is the largest juried woodworking exhibition of its type anywhere. The exhibition is open to all interested adult woodworkers. There are three classes for woodturners to enter pieces:

Class 14 Wood Turning – Center Work: Parallel to the ways of the lathe

Class 15 Wood Turning – Embellished/Mixed Media

Class 16 Wood Turning Laminated/Segmented

An entry form can be downloaded from sdfwa.org/2010DIWEntryForm.pdf. Online registration starts in mid-March and all entries must be submitted by 5:00 PM PST on Friday April 30th. Submission is by digital photographs with your entry form. See sdfwa.org/diw/2009/photogallery.htm for a photo gallery of last year's winners. I see no reason why MCW members could not easily hold our own with the turners from the left coast.

➤ **The Art Of Applied Design – DHM Digital Gallery – Oklahoma State University**

Designers working with wood are invited to participate in an international juried competition. Application deadline for digital images is July 15, 2010. All submitted works must be functional objects commonly used within interior spaces, such as furnishings (hard or soft), utensils, fixtures, or containers. Objects that are purely decorative are not eligible. Evaluation will be based upon uniqueness, creativity, craftsmanship, and quality of the submitted digital image. The entirely online exhibit [available from September 15th to December 1st, 2010] will include e-mail addresses of accepted artists to facilitate independent sales of work.
